Had a Loss of Pressure

BOIL YOUR WATER BEFORE USING

Este informe contiene información muy importante sobre su agua potable. Tradúzcalo o hable con alguien que lo entienda bien.

We had a line break on July 18, 2026 which resulted in a significant loss of pressure in the drinking water system.

What does this mean? What should I do?

- **DO NOT DRINK THE WATER WITHOUT BOILING IT FIRST.** Bring all water to a boil, let it boil for three (3) minutes, and let it cool before using, OR use bottled water. Boiled or bottled water should be used for drinking, making ice, brushing teeth, washing dishes, and food preparation until further notice. Boiling kills bacteria and other organisms in the water.
- Water main breaks resulting in a loss of system pressure can introduce disease-causing organisms into the water system. These organisms include bacteria, viruses, and parasites, which can cause short-term effects, such as nausea, cramps, diarrhea and associated headaches. The symptoms above are not caused only by organisms in drinking water. If you experience any of these symptoms and they persist, you may want to seek medical advice.
- If you have an infant, severely compromised immune system, are pregnant, or are elderly, you may be at increased risk and should seek advice from your doctor about drinking this water. General guidelines on ways to lessen the risk of infection by bacteria and other disease-causing organisms are available from EPA's Safe Drinking Water Hotline at 1-800-426-4791.

What is being done?

- We will inform you when tests show no bacteria and you no longer need to boil your water.
A line break occurred.
Pressure was lost due to an operational issue.
The line break has been repaired / The line break will be repaired shortly.
Pumps have been repaired / Pumps will be repaired shortly.
System pressure has been restored / System pressure will be restored shortly.
While water service is unavailable, water is available for pickup at ____ (location).
We will flush our system and test for bacteria contamination.
You are advised to boil your water for drinking, making ice, brushing teeth, washing

dishes, and food preparation until you receive notice that the water is safe.
Upon notice that the water is safe, you should run your water for 2-3 minutes to flush any sediment that may be in the water.

- Leak in system, pipe has been repaired and system pressure restored
